The 14th ACM Multimedia and Security Workshop (MMSec) will be held at the University of Warwick in Coventry, UK, from September 6-7, 2012. Since its inauguration in 1998, MMSec has been intended for disseminating knowledge in the areas of multimedia security such as data protection, multimedia forensics, hidden communications and biometrics, as well as topics in privacy, policy and legal issues in relation to multimedia security and forensics in real world applications. We expect the workshop to facilitate cross-fertilisation of ideas among key stakeholders from academia, industry, practitioners and government agencies around the globe.

### SCOPE AND TOPICS

Papers addressing issues of secure multimedia processing, access, distribution, storage and consumption are welcomed. Theoretical and practical coverage of the following topics will be considered. We also welcome software and hardware demos. Topics include but are not limited to:.

- Integrity verification of digital content
- Source device identification and linking
- Multimedia watermarking, fingerprinting and identification
- Multimedia network protection, privacy and security
- Multimedia authentication and encryption
- Signal Processing in the Encrypted Domain
- Steganography and steganalysis
- Biometrics
- Application of smart cards and ID cards
- Secure multimedia system design and protocol security
- Security evaluation and benchmarks
- Emerging applications
- Privacy, policy and legal issues as well as their interaction with technological development

### PAPER SUBMISSION

Full and short papers are solicited. Full papers should be 7-10 pages long, short papers 4-6 pages. Please prepare your manuscripts in the ACM format available at <http://www.acm.org/sigs/pubs/proceed/template.html> and indicate as to whether your manuscripts are intended for general or special sessions when submitting them. Manuscripts will be rigorously evaluated by the Technical Programme Committee. Accepted papers will be published in the ACM workshop proceedings. Authors of selected papers presented at the Workshop in the forensics and biometrics areas will be invited to submit an extended and updated version for publication in a designated issue of the International Journal of Digital Crime and Forensics (<http://www.igi-global.com/journal/international-journal-digital-crime-forensics/1112>) and the new IET Biometrics Journal ([www.IETDL.org/IET-MBT](http://www.IETDL.org/IET-MBT)).



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
